
Following the Returns, Hour by Hour

Senate

The top Senate race is in Nevada, where Democratic Majority Leader Harry Reid faces Sharron Angle, a tea-party-backed Republican who wasn't the choice of GOP leaders. The Delaware race has also attracted attention though Democrats are expected to keethe seat—because of ontroversial comments by Christine O'Donnell (R). Alaskanas the most topsy-turvy race, with incumbent Sen. Lisa Murkowski staging a write-in campaign against Joe Miller (R) and Scott McAdams (D).





House of Representatives

A growing number of analysts say close to 100 seats are at least marginally competitive, the great majority of them held by Democrats. In Pennsylvania and Ohio, for example, five Democrats are at risk in each state; whether the GOP wins them all could signal what kind of night it's going to be.

Rep. Tim Bishop faced one of the earliest raucous town-hall meetings in August 2009.






